## **Matters arising:**

#### **Christmas:**

- Lynn will get green and white serviettes and ask Martin if he has red ones.

- It was suggested we have candles in bottles on the tables.
- Mike has Italian bunting and cocktail flags.
- Tickets are being reserved and we should be able to get 36 guests. Just need to collect payments. Agreed to offer MP complimentary tickets in recognition of considerable assistance with printing.

### **Heritage Trail:**

- Plans are in place for the Trail to be ready for the launch in July.
- Bolsover Woodlands Enterprise have been engaged to do two days of work clearing and cutting back the woodland area on the Green to make it safe and more accessible and to promote wildlife. It can then be incorporated into a short accessible route round the Green. The PC were approached about sharing the cost. This was discussed at their January meeting. They agreed to the work being done but were unable to identify a budget in the current financial year. The Heritage Café will absorb the cost with a view to seeking Lottery funding for further work in partnership with BWE.
- Cath explained that the PC are setting up a small community fund for the next financial year
  for which local organisations can submit bids. It was agreed that the BVA would submit
  requests for discussion at the May PC meeting.
- The Funding received for the Heritage Café and Trail has enabled the Café to run for two
  years and the Trail to be completed. The project has been enjoyed and appreciated by locals
  and people from further afield in NE Derbyshire and a lot of contacts and links have been
  made. It would be good to keep this going in some form if possible.
- Catherine volunteered to develop a heritage section on the BVA Facebook page using info from the website and seeking additional photos etc. from local people in order to promote interest more widely.
- Mike gave an update on information he is sharing with Clare Hartwell (Editor of the Pevsner Guides) concerning Wessington Manor.

#### **Summer 2020 Picnic and Trail Launch:**

- Miss Marina Mae (singer) has been booked from 4.30 to 7.30pm
- Singleton Event Services have been booked for 1<sup>st</sup> Aid cover
